

Scripture Reflection by Deacon Richard J. Quistorff

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

There's an idea about God that we are all used to, and we should get used to it, because in many senses it's perfectly true, which is that God loves and embraces us just as we are. There are plenty of scripture readings that tell us that, from the Prodigal Son to all those meals Jesus ate with sinners, they tell us there is nothing we need to do on this earth to merit God's love, we have it without asking for it, without earning it. And we should believe it, because it tells us that we have a relationship with God that can't be broken, no matter how careless or imperfect we are about our end of that relationship.

There are three Sundays this year where we get what you might call some additional information, and after hearing these stories we might feel like it's not so clear that God loves us so unconditionally. Last week, you might remember the gospel was the one about the foolish bridesmaids, who had one job, and didn't do it, and were left outside the wedding feast what looked like permanently. Next week, we'll hear about the last judgment, and it turns out maybe there are some simple questions asked there that we may not be able to give good answers to. And today, we hear the parable of the talents, people like us with huge sums of money given them to invest, and at the end there's quite literally an accounting, and one player who was afraid to play the game doesn't just lose, but loses everything.

What does this gospel story of the three servants and their talents tell us about God? It doesn't sound much like a Jesus story, does it? A literal competition with two winners and one loser? It doesn't seem like the same Jesus who says that his yoke is easy and his burden is light. But really what Jesus is saying in this parable is a logical extension of our not needing to earn God's love, of our being loved unconditionally, because what we see here is Jesus telling a story that asks why we don't act like we know that God loves us. Because that unconditional love is not an excuse for us to do nothing in this life. Instead, it is a reason to be willing to try anything.

The fact is, while God might love us and embrace us the way we are, we have very strong evidence from the scriptures that God is not satisfied with the condition of this world. In case you haven't noticed, it's not good.

Look around us.

You see inequality among people even in wealthy nations, shocking neglect, and indifference to people who have lost homes and countries, lack of care for the resources and environment God gave us, religious suspicion and hatred everywhere. Read through the Old Testament as well as the New and you'll see that these are things that God does not accept the way they are, they offend God's sense of what the people God created should experience on this earth. This world should be rebuilt into a new kingdom. But, when it comes to building that kingdom, which Jesus told us was the new way to live for all of us, there's almost nothing we could try in the building process that to us doesn't look very, very risky.

Think of trying to help people in need, even one person. It's impossible to do that without running the risk of frustration and ingratitude and failure; a lot of times it doesn't work in the way we'd all like it to.

It's a risk.

Changing careers or taking on a new project, putting yourself forward more directly at the service of others, means giving up something you know for something you don't.

That's a risk.

Going out to lobby or work for almost any kind of change is a risk; so often it doesn't work, at least not the first or the tenth or the hundredth time. You can play and lose over and over before you win.

We're human, we'd rather have even an unsatisfactory status quo we know than something risky that we don't. But that makes us like the last servant in this story, burying his money in the ground because it's safe there. He won't lose. And yet in a way he's burying himself alive. Without risk, says this gospel, not much good can happen for anyone.

We're being pushed a little hard in this gospel to worry less about what we might lose in life, and to set our eyes on what we could win, if only we allowed ourselves to feel God's love for us, if only we could see the safety net that is actually underneath us always. Today's gospel is not promising us success in everything, but that the risk of trying to put God's gifts to work is better than the fear of losing. Never bury a talent. Place a bet with it and see what happens.
