Stewardship as a Way of Life:

"My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established..." Luke 16:25-26

When God created the world He declared that it was good and He gave it to all mankind for us to enjoy. However, over the years we have created a chasm between those who have great gifts and those who do not. In today's Gospel we see that with our own generosity we must bridge that gap between those who have much and those who have little, or we may find ourselves on the wrong side of the chasm in the next life.

"But Abraham replied, 'Son, that in your lifetime you received your good things, while Lazarus received bad things, but now he is comforted here and you are in agony. Luke 16:25

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, as we gather for the celebration of the Eucharist this weekend, our hearts turn with tenderness toward those among us who carry the pain of suicide. We hold close in prayer the families who have lost loved ones, those who struggle with mental illness and all who walk alongside them with love, courage and faith. In recent years, our understanding of mental health has grown. We now recognize that mental illness is not a moral failing, but a genuine health condition one that calls for our compassion, our support and our pastoral care. Suicide is often the heartbreaking result of an illness that overwhelms a person's ability to cope. It is a reality that can touch any life. Throughout the month of September, we join others across the country in observing Suicide Prevention Month. I've invited all our Area Catholic Communities to mark this weekend as a time of special remembrance — for those who have died by suicide, and for the family members, friends, and neighbors who grieve their loss. We know that one in four people live with mental illness, and that approximately 1.5 million people attempt suicide each year. Many of us carry the memory of someone we've known — a loved one, a friend, a member of our parish—whose life ended too soon under the weight of mental suffering. To the families who mourn, please know that your grief is held in the heart of the Church. We see you. We stand with you. And we pray with you. We believe in the boundless mercy of God — a mercy that reaches into the deepest darkness and brings light. We trust in the loving embrace of our Lord for all His children, especially those most in need of his peace. Christ's own suffering and death opened the gates of Heaven, and we hold fast to that promise of eternal life. We also lift up those who are currently navigating the challenges of mental illness, and the families who support them. You are not alone. Seeking help is a sign of strength — a courageous step toward healing. Our diocese is committed to fostering a community where the dignity of every person impacted by mental health challenges is affirmed, and where resources for support and healing are accessible and encouraged. To those who are struggling; please reach out. Talk to someone you trust. Seek professional help. Know that your life is precious, and you are deeply loved. And to those who have survived the loss of a loved one to suicide: when you are ready, know that sharing your story can be a source of healing and hope for others. May this Suicide Healing and Remembrance Weekend be a powerful witness to the enduring love of Christ. Let us pray that His peace will fill every heart in need with courage and hope. May Our Lady of Sorrows, who stood faithfully at the foot of the Cross, intercede for us. And may Almighty God bless you all, † in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
