Scripture Reflection by Father Matt

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ Jesus,

The Holy Mass is the greatest prayer we can offer as a Church. We respond to Jesus' invitation to "Do this in memory of Me." By offering the Holy Mass we fulfill our purpose as Church, as the Body of Christ. Our offering of Holy Mass includes the public reading and meditation on Sacred Scripture, our Liturgy of the Word. It also includes our public renewal of the declaration of our faith in the Nicene Creed and our prayer intentions, our petitions. But ultimately it is the Eucharist that makes the Mass the most powerful prayer we can offer to the Father, the very Body and Blood of Christ offered to the Father for the remission of sins and the upbuilding of the Church.

The priest who celebrates the Mass does so for a specific Intention. We list these intentions in the bulletin so that you can join in praying for that particular intention, but you can also bring your own prayer intention to Mass each time you take part in the celebration. Like Mary interceded for the wedding family in our Gospel this week, we too can intercede for others with our prayers. Is there someone in your life who is ill, suffering, or in trouble? Consider offering your Mass for them. Just as we offer fasting or give alms for a particular intention so too we offer prayers for those in need. We can offer any prayer for our intentions, but there is no greater prayer than the Mass.

If you would like me to celebrate a Mass for your prayer intentions, please talk to Ann in the parish office. We have lots of openings for Mass intentions this year, and you can offer multiple Masses for your intention or for multiple intentions. You can offer a Mass Intention for someone who has died (we mark those with a cross next to their name in the bulletin), for a public intention for the living (like an anniversary, and upcoming surgery, or a special event), or for a private intention that will only be known to the priest and the secretary (we list these as Special Intentions in the bulletin). There is a suggested donation of \$10 per Mass intention, but this is optional. What is truly important is offering the Mass for your intentions. This is our most powerful prayer, our duty and our right as a Church, to offer the Holy Mass for the salvation of souls and the sanctification of the world.

Pro-Life Message #3

Think About Life...

Sometimes you hear people argue that abortion should be legal if the family would experience lower quality of life because of the baby's birth. The example might be given that a family will not be able to support another child and will become even poorer. But it is never justifiable to kill some innocent people in order to improve the condition of other people.

If the issue is poverty, we wouldn't encourage a poor mother with eight children to kill the oldest three who eat the most. So encouraging her to kill the youngest and most vulnerable child – the one in her womb – does not make any sense.

People may be poor for different reasons. Sometimes they lack the education or the opportunity to succeed. Sometimes they live in an economically depressed area and cannot find adequate jobs. Sometimes they make poor decisions – like dropping out of school or using drugs, which limit their opportunities later. In some instances, they are oppressed by negligent, greedy, or power-hungry employers or governments. And in other circumstances, their nations are torn by war and conflict. Oftentimes, those around them who are better off do not provide the assistance and care that they could and should. But regardless of the reason, it is not fair to blame the unborn child for the problems that adults create. Besides, abortion does not solve any of these problems. Abortion has been legal in most places in the world for over 40 years, yet there is no evidence that it has reduced poverty.

From a quality of life point of view, it is important to deeply consider what we mean by "poverty." It is very rare in the Western world for anybody to starve to death because they have too many children. In fact, it's doubtful that this has ever happened in the United States in contemporary times. Having children can certainly make things economically difficult. If a family has several children, they will usually make many material sacrifices that other families don't have to make. But it generally does not mean that anyone will have to starve to death. Our generous nation has many religious and social programs that prevent something like that from happening. So the real question becomes: should one person have to die so that other people don't have to sacrifice material quality of life? If we answer, "No," then we should do everything we can to eliminate poverty, while fiercely protecting the lives of those who are most vulnerable.



Sacraments

Families that would like their children to be baptized or receive the sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation or couples that would like to be married here should be registered and active members of the parish.

Sacrament of Baptism: Requirements for having your child baptized at the Church of St. Henry are: registration at St. Henry (or another parish) and attendance at a pre-baptism class. Parents are encouraged to register to take the class before their child is born. This class is normally offered every two months. For more information, call the parish office at 346-4240. Please note, this class is only required if this Baptism is for your first child.

Sacraments of Penance/Reconciliation: Please contact the Religious Education office at 346-7030 for first time Preparation.
